1892 (first version) ^[1]	 Why are you here? That's a good place to start! How about: "We mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor." Declaration of Independence, 1776 (https://www.archives.gov/founding-docs/declaration-transcript) Reading of the First Amendment "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances." (https://editorials.voa.gov/a/the-importance-of-the-first-amendment-/3733070.html)]
"I pledge allegiance to my Flag and the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."	
1892 to 1923 (early revision by Bellamy) ^[2]	
"I pledge allegiance to my Flag and <u>to</u> the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."	
1923 to 1924 ^[3]	
"I pledge allegiance to <u>the</u> Flag <u>of the United</u> <u>States</u> and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."	
1924 to 1954 ^[3]	
"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States <u>of America</u> and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."	
1954 (current version, per 4 U.S.C. §4) ^[4]	
"I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one <u>Nation</u> <u>under God</u> , indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."
